### Prior Knowledge

The countries that make up the UK and the seas and oceans England, which is in the United Kingdom, is in the continent of Europe.  
The seven continents (including Europe) and five oceans recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features

### Key Vocabulary

Atlas – book of maps

Capital city - the city where the government sits. London is the capital city of England and the UK-

City = a large town

Climate - the general weather conditions that are typical of a place

Coasts – an area of land that is next to the Sea

Compass point - any of the main points of a compass: north, south, east, west, north-east, north-west, south-east, south-west

Continent = a very large area of land that consists of many countries. Europe is a continent

Country - an area of land that is controlled by its own government.

Globe - a ball-shaped object with a map of the world on it

Landmark- a building or feature which is easily recognised

Ocean - one of the five very large areas of salt water on the Earth's surface

Population - all the people who live in a country
