

The School Day



- School Day: 8:50am—3:20pm
- Break: 15 minutes within the am session
- Lunch: 1 hour eat lunch and play
- Main difference is a set playtime in the morning with Year 4 and 5
- The children will play on the KS2 playground at playtime and at lunch.

Wrap Around Care

- Morning Club This will be a flat rate cost of £3.00 (free for children eligible for Pupil premium). This does include breakfast (toast or cereal). Booking for breakfast club can be done by contacting the school office. The morning club starts at 7.45am and drop off is to the Multipurpose room at the side of school by the staff car park.
- Wrap around after school club This is currently being considered to start in September. This will be a flat rate of £5.00 per session and will be from 3:20pm when school finished to 5:20pm
- After school clubs These will be curriculum enhancement clubs and run weekly. After school clubs will run in 10 week blocks so please make sure you check the start dates and end dates as they do not run the full term. Clubs will run until 4.30pm and the cost of a 10 week block will be £20 to cover staffing and resources (Pupil Premium children will be entitled to 1 free block). Please keep a look out on Class Dojo in early September for when to sign up.


Curriculum

Children in Key Stage 2 will be participating in well developed curriculum which will include gardening and cooking. They will have daily spelling and whole class guided reading Literacy and maths sessions.

Two PE sessions a week

In addition to their class teacher, they will also work with other adults for different curriculum subjects and interventions.


Year 3 cloakroom and outside door

Behaviour and Discipline

- Dojos
- Praising Assembly
- Weekly certificates
- Start dojo certificates
- Within Key Stage 2, the children are praised for good behaviour using dojos.
- Children are organised into four coloured teams and in praising assembly every Friday, the team from each class that has earned the most dojos displays its ribbons on the class merit cup.
- A 'dojo winner' from each class is also chosen during the assembly, alongside one weekly award winners for being either caring, curious, collaborative and courageous.





- If children do not follow school rules, they will first be reminded of the teacher's expectations verbally.
- If they continue to behave inappropriately, they will be given a second warning and will move onto the amber traffic light.
- If children still continue they will receive their final warning and move onto the red traffic light. This will result in them missing their next break time and a dojo being sent home.
- If in the event, a child refuses to adhere to classroom rules and sufficient warnings have been given, the child will be asked to work in another supervised area. The child will return once they comply with the teacher's instructions and guidelines.
- Children will return back onto green traffic light in the afternoon

- •Name inside all clothes especially jumpers and cardigans

Work at Home

•Daily reading – to support their reading, it is important to encourage your child to read and by recording this information in the planner.

•The children are expected to read 4 times a week .

- •The children are rewarded through the use of dojos
- •During the school week, your child's home reading book will be changed once a week and go home on a Friday
- •Children will be expected to go on Times Table Rockstars at least three times a week.
